

DID YOU KNOW?



DID YOU KNOW.....when providing screening services to service recipients they should be collected under the client category of service recipient not uniquely identified? These service recipients are not formally *registered* in a program, but service provision is provided.

For example:

- Health professional who filters through large amounts of information from multiple sources (data mining) when screening referrals to determine whether an individual would meet the criteria for inclusion in the program. During this screening referrals process the individual would not be registered into the program and would therefore be collected under the client category of Service Recipient Not Uniquely Identified.

Service Recipients not Uniquely Identified

An individual who receives one or more services from a health service organization when not currently *registered* as an inpatient, resident, client hospital, client community, client home care, facility/organization/citizen partnership and whose encounter is not recorded in the registration or information system of the organization and who has no unique identifier assigned to record and track services (MIS Standards, 2022).
